

Pupil Premium

The Pupil Premium was introduced in April 2011. This funding is allocated for pupils from low income families eligible for free school meals, looked after children and those from families of Armed Forces personnel.

The amount of funding allocated to Holy Family in 2013-14 was £22,500. Compared to schools nationally the percentage of children entitled to this funding is very low at our school.

As a school we can decide how to spend the Pupil Premium money for the benefit of our children. However, we will be held to account on how we have used this funding and the impact it has had. At Holy Family this money was spent on the following:

- To provide targeted interventions
- Teaching assistant support
- Additional small teaching group support for morning teaching sessions in both KS1 and KS2
- Residential trip subsidy
