## Pupil Premium Statement.

### What is the Pupil Premium Grant?

The Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) is funding given to schools to help close the attainment gap between children from low-income and other disadvantaged families and their peers. Pupil Premium Grant is primarily aimed at pupils who are from low-income families and are eligible for Free School Meals (FSM ). This category now includes any child that has been registered for FSM in the past 6 years (Known as 'Ever 6 FSM'). This funding also covers Children Looked After (CLA), children adopted from care under the Adoption and Children Act 2002 and children who have left care under a Special Guardianship or Residence Order. Schools also receive a service premium for pupils whose parents either serve in the armed forces or are in receipt of a child pension from the ministry of Defence. Careful analysis including: internal and external pupil-level data, historical attainment and progress rates is undertaken on an annual basis to ensure that the Pupil Premium Grant is used to maximum effect.

The purpose of this document is to outline how the Pupil Premium Grant will be allocated to support pupils during the period September 2015 and July 2016.

### **Pupil Premium 2014/15 and its impact**

For 2014 – 15 the allocation was £36,200 and was spent on the following:

- To provide targeted interventions
- Teaching assistant support
- Additional small teaching group support for morning teaching sessions in both KS1 and KS2
- Residential trip subsidy.

### **Impact and headline data 2014-2015.**

Pupils in receipt of pupil premium by the end of Key Stage 2 attained much higher than like pupils nationally in reading and mathematics. For writing and English, Grammar, Punctuation and spelling, the pupils are broadly in line compared with the like pupils national.

Value added measures demonstrate that by the end of Key Stage 2, the progress of our children in receipt of pupil premium were very good in comparison to both: like children nationally and all children nationally.
